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Community Healthcare Acquires 80K SF Office from Novartis

EAST HANOVER, NJ—Community Healthcare Associates acquired an 80,807-square-foot office building at 1 S. Ridgedale Ave. in East Hanover, NJ from global pharmaceutical firm Novartis for \$5 million.

Transwestern vice president **Leslie Meril** represented **CHA**, a Bloomfield, NJ-based company that specializes in the redevelopment and revitalization of custom-built medical arts complexes and office suites. The new owner plans to redevelop the property into a skilled nursing and rehabilitation center. **Novartis** was represented in the transaction by **Steven Schultz**, executive managing director of **Newmark Knight Frank**.

Since 2008 **Community Healthcare Associates** has successfully revitalized and constructed new healthcare facilities in both New Jersey and New York resulting in job creation and preservation of community-based healthcare.

Successful projects have included the repositioning of the former **Barnert Hospital** in Paterson; the overhaul of the 100,000 square-foot former **William B. Kessler Memorial Hospital** in Hammonton; and the conversion of the shuttered **Greenville Hospital** into the fully occupied **Greenville Medical Arts Complex** in Jersey City. Earlier this year, **CHA** announced plans to develop a 186,000 square-foot medical arts complex and 120 luxury residential apartments at the site of the former **Muhlenberg Hospital** in Plainfield in the early part of 2018.

"The repositioning of conventional office space for medical uses is a complex process that requires considerable expertise," says **Meril**. "The process is simplified when dealing with a company such as **CHA**, which has a first-class reputation in the world of community-based healthcare."

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
